Dr. Brent D. Glass, Director Emeritus of the Smithsonian's National Museum of American History, will speak on the value of history and the importance of public memory in America and the issues society faces in preserving and presenting the past, at the Plenary at the Statehouse at the Idaho Heritage Conference on Thursday, Sept. 26.



Glass brings great experience in preservation, interpretation, and promotion of history to the conference. As the Director of

the Smithsonian's National Museum of American History from 2002-2011, he led a two-year, \$85 million renovation and development of 20 new exhibitions for the 2008 reopening of the museum, including the Star Spangled Banner, Abraham Lincoln: An Extraordinary Life, and On the Water: Stories from Maritime America. Dr. Glass is a Federal Commissioner of the U.S. Flight 93 Memorial Advisory Commission, and is a member of the U.S. State Department Bilateral U.S. Russian Presidential Commission Working Group on Education, Culture, Sports and Media.

Now, as a consultant, he has worked on projects across the country, ranging from the Presidio in San Francisco to the Alaska Native Heritage Center in Anchorage and the Museum of the Shenandoah Valley in Winchester, Virginia. A public historian, Dr. Glass has also made appearances on Oprah and The Colbert Report, in addition to world-wide speaking engagements. He is a graduate of Harvard University's Kennedy School of Government nonprofit executive leadership program.

The Idaho Heritage Conference is Sept. 25-27, 2013, in Boise. It is \$79 for general attendees, which includes access to all events, including meals, and one field session. It is \$25 for students, which includes a field session and all educational sessions. Educational sessions are at the Idaho Statehouse. Late registration begins Sept. 25 and is \$99 per person. Conference registration is not required for the Plenary at the Statehouse.
